



Find the right qualification for you

Whether you've recently finished school, are currently working, or are returning to study after a long break, we have a study option to suit your needs.

We offer a range of nationally recognised qualifications at all levels—so whether you're just starting out in your studies, or looking to transition to a university degree, we have the resources to support you every step of the way.

Certificates

Certificate level courses are available from Certificate I to Certificate IV. They generally run for six months to 2 years full-time, or can be undertaken part-time, and some are completed as apprenticeships or traineeships.

You'll study through a combination of on-campus, on-line and practical work skills to prepare you for the workforce.

Diplomas & Advanced Diplomas

Diplomas and Advanced Diplomas are designed to prepare you for a career in your chosen field, and often act as a stepping stone to further study at a university level.

Diplomas generally run from one to two-and-a-half years, and many students undertake their Diploma while working.


Degrees

We have partnerships with some of Victoria's largest universities, including La Trobe University and Charles Sturt University. These partnerships give you the opportunity to pathway from a GOTAFE qualification to a university degree in a number of disciplines, including Health, Community Services, Business, and Veterinary Nursing/Technology.

You can also earn credit towards your degree from studies in some of our Diploma and Certificate IV courses, which may reduce the overall time required to finish your degree.

GOTAFE offers a range of courses for students aged between 15-18 years to help you realise your potential and set you on the path to success. Best of all, you don't need an ATAR to kick-start your training at TAFE.

VET Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS)

If you're a secondary school student looking to get a head-start in your future career, the VET Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS) program is for you. VETDSS allows students in years 10, 11 or 12 VCE or VCAL, to study a nationally recognised TAFE qualification as part of their senior secondary schooling.

Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL)

VCAL is a hands-on, practical alternative qualification to VCE (Year 11 and 12). As a VCAL student you will study industry related strands that interest you, while strengthening your literacy and numeracy skills to help you succeed in the workforce. VCAL is self-directed and allows you to combine study with part-time work, so you can apply new skills as you learn them.

School-Based Apprenticeship

School-based apprenticeships and traineeships allow secondary school students to start an apprenticeship or traineeship while still at school. As part of a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship you will spend a minimum of one day a week on the job, plus a portion of the school holidays. You will also be required to complete the GOTAFE component of training plus your other VCE or VCAL subjects.



"GOTAFE offers a variety of VET courses for a Year 11 student to pick from and it is local. I had great dealings with the VETDSS staff who were very friendly and extremely helpful. My daughter wanted to change courses and the staff made the transition to the preferred course so easy. I now have a daughter doing the course she wants to do and enjoying it.

Start your career while you're studying

If you can't wait to get into the workforce, then an Apprenticeship or Traineeship may be right for you. Studying a Pre-apprenticeship, Apprenticeship, or Traineeship gives you the opportunity to start your career while you're training. You'll work for an employer and learn on the job, while also completing additional training at GOTAFE.

What is an Apprenticeship or Traineeship?

An Apprenticeship or Traineeship is a contract between an employer and employee that combines paid onthe-job training and formal study. An Apprenticeship or Traineeship allows you to combine formal training from GOTAFE with on-the-job training from an employer, meaning you can apply new skills as you learn them.

You can complete your training on a full-time or part-time schedule, and you can even begin your Apprenticeship before you finish school. Apprentices learn valuable, nationally recognised skills, and many use their training as a foot-in-the-door to beginning a career in their chosen industry.

Apprenticeships are generally skilled trades, and take a number of years to complete before you're fully qualified to work independently. Traineeships cover a broader range of occupations (such as Business and IT), and are usually completed within one to two years.

Pre-Apprenticeships


A Pre-Apprenticeship course prepares you for the workforce by teaching you the hands-on skills you'll be using day-to-day as an apprentice or trainee.

Pre-Apprenticeships are not mandatory, but they do have a number of benefits:

- · Learn basic skills to help you succeed in your Apprenticeship;
- Get exposure to your chosen industry before you commit to a full Apprenticeship;
- Show future employers that you're committed and passionate about the industry; and
- In some instances, reduce the length of a formal Apprenticeship.

A Pre-Apprenticeship is tied to a Certificate II in your chosen industry, but unlike a formal Apprenticeship, you don't need to have an employer before you start the course. You can complete a Pre-Apprenticeship at a training provider such as GOTAFE, or as part of your VCE or VCAL studies if you're still at school.

Study Pathways





Skills & Jobs Centres are a one-stop-shop for anyone looking for career planning advice. These centres are Government-funded, and you don't have to be a GOTAFE student to get advice and support.

Skills & Job Centres work alongside local industry and communities to provide expert advice and assistance on training and employment opportunities, including:

- Identifying training qualifications for a successful career transition
- · Assistance in using existing skills to align to a new job or to undertake new training (including advice on Recognition of Prior Learning)
- · Deliver focused workshops to build skills, such as resume writing
- Information on local employment trends and areas with skills shortages
- Creating a personal career plan or training pathway
- · Referrals to other service providers

The Careers Advisors can assist with skills assessment, share job hunting tips, and provide guidance to anyone looking to up-skill or re-skill through professional training.

Free TAFE



GOTAFE offers a wide range of Free TAFE courses to help you explore exciting new opportunities.

The Government's Free TAFE for Priority Courses is here to help you stress less while you study and overcome financial barriers that might be stopping you from pursuing the course of your dreams.

The idea is to upskill more people for jobs that are in demand across Victoria. Some of them lead to work in important areas like preventing family violence or delivering major infrastructure projects.

If eligible, your tuition fees will be paid for by the Government. Please note there may be some out-of-pocket expenses incurred from material and service fees.

JobTrainer

JobTrainer is a joint Commonwealth and State initiative which provides additional funding to increase access to free or low fee training places for young people and job seekers.

If eligible, you can access up to one full qualification and one short course or skill set across a wide range of in-demand industries such as health, construction, agriculture, community services, baking and cookery, financial services, IT and cybersecurity, and beauty services. A few important details

If you're eligible for the JobTrainer initiative, tuition fees for selected courses may be either discounted to 20% of the standard tuition fee or free. Please note there may be some outof-pocket expenses incurred from material and service fees. Students who have previously used their Free TAFE entitlement may also enrol in a course under JobTrainer, if they meet the eligibility requirements.

Learning Support Unit

The Learning Support Unit is a free and confidential service designed to help you build the foundation skills you need to be successful.


We offer one-on-one tutoring, group tutoring, and classroom-based support, and also have a drop-in centre, so you can get the academic help you need, whenever you need it.

We can help you up-skill in the following:

- Study skills and time management
- Effective reading and note-taking
- Computer skills
- Referencing and research
- Oral presentations and public speaking
- Interpreting assignment questions
- Assignment writing
- English language skills, including spelling and grammar
- Maths
- Exam preparation.

Apprenticeship Support

Apprenticeship Support Officers give guidance to all apprentices aged 15 to 24 in the first year of their apprenticeship. They offer advice on personal and workplace issues.



Student Success Advisors

Transitioning into study can be a big challenge to individuals, families, and sometimes at a community level. When there are other things going on in your life, it can be hard to dedicate enough time to keeping up with your studies. This is where our Student Success Advisors come in.

They will work with you to help you build life skills, set goals for your future, and keep you connected to your community so you have all the support you need to succeed.

Student Success Advisors are qualified support workers who can also help you with issues impacting your studies, such as:

- Finding study difficult
- Family problems
- Health concerns
- Homelessness
- Centrelink issues
- Time management
- Course payment plans
- Issues within the classroom
- Advocacy
- Relationships with others

All your interactions with Student Success Advisors are confidential, except in situations where you or someone else is at significant risk of harm. Student Success Advisors are available at the Shepparton, Wangaratta, Benalla, and Seymour campuses, and can also provide support via phone or email to students studying off-campus or by distance.

Counselling

GOTAFE offers free support through its counselling services. You can speak to a counsellor face-to-face on campus, or set up a phone appointment. GOTAFE counsellors are not experts in your life (only you are!), but they can help you explore and open up new possibilities.

Some of the things our counsellors can help you with include:

- Personal or family issues
- Relationship issues
- Grief and loss
- Work-related issues
- Study-related issues
- Time management and goal setting
- Mental health issues, such as depression and anxiety
- Promotion of health and wellbeing
- Drug and alcohol problems
- Any other issues, or general concerns

If our counsellors are unable to help you, they'll refer you to another service.

Support for Students with Disabilities

If you have a disability that needs support to ensure you can fully engage with your learning and in student life, then the Student Success Team is here to help. They can ensure that appropriate strategies for participation and learning are put in place. They can suggest and negotiate appropriate 'reasonable adjustments' that can be made for support so that you can successfully complete your studies.

Other support services that may be offered include:

- Assistance with your course application and enrolment
- Orientation to campus facilities
- Classroom participation assistance
- **Tutorial** assistance
- Adaptive technology, such as Text to Speech programs, JAWS for the blind, ergonomic chairs and computer accessories, etc.
- Alternative formatting
- Liaison with teachers/coordinators
- Assessment accommodations
- Providing sign interpreters
- Liaising with external agencies
- Access to the TAFE Specialist Employment Partnerships (TSEP)
